

If you found yourself near Clifton Primary School last week chances are you were greeted with lots of noise from the many children that attended this April's King's Camps programme. From 14<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> April 120 children took part in various sports, fun games, team challenges, arts & crafts, drama etc.

King's Camps International (KCI) has been conducting activity programmes for children during the holidays since December 2006. KCI generates income for The King's Foundation Botswana so all money collected at the Clifton King's Camp will go towards regular outreach programmes at the Destitute Centre in Monarch and the Chedu Choga grounds near the blocks to name a few.

KCI was established to: 1) meet the increasing need of working parents for quality children's programmes during Botswana's long school holidays, 2) provide employment for local sports coaches struggling to find work and 3) generate income for community outreach work.

The Francistown community showed their support for this very important programme by sponsoring children to attend and by donating certificates for each child. The Rotary Club of Francistown sponsored ten children that could not otherwise afford such an experience and Stenographix generously donated all of the certificates for the children.
